We are really proud to see Springfield Village coming to life; The partnerships between our Trust and our development and construction partners continue to strengthen to really build a community offer that everyone can be involved in.

STEP Update on the delivery of Springfield Village

Things that we will be working on

Sir Robert McAlpine (Healthcare, Park and Infrastructure Main Contractor)

Mental Health Buildings

- External brickwork is nearing completion on both the Trinity (formerly known as Non-Forensic) and Shaftesbury (Forensic) buildings with scaffolding being removed as areas are completed
- Ongoing installation of internal walls, ceilings and mechanical, electrical and plumbing
- Commenced installation of joinery, flooring and painting and decorating to Trinity building and screeding in Shaftesbury building

Park and Infrastructure

- Park works progressing with earthwork movement, drainage and the construction of ponds. The pedestrian bridge will be delivered in mid-November and the trees will start to be planted at the end of November.
- Road construction around the new hospitals is progressing with vehicular and pedestrian access opened up between Storey building and Elizabeth Newton

Barratt (Housing Developer B-E, L&M)

- We are looking forward to launching our new show home and marketing suite to Block M in the first quarter of 2022
- Superstructure works continue to our apartment blocks to Parcel L & M along with Parcels B through to C. We should be at our first roof levels in December with first completions anticipated for May 2022



- We are progressing foundations to Parcel E1 & E2 with superstructure due to commence in November.
- Aside from construction activity; we have also carried out a number of volunteer days to help tidy up the hospital grounds and assist the occupational therapists with producing an allotment for patients.
- The Barratt team are actively raising funds to support causes for homelessness and mental health charities along with raising awareness on site by bringing in external experts to carry out workshops.

City & Country (Heritage Developer R & S)

- The Sales area was launched successfully at the beginning of June and remains open 7 days a week.
- Structural alterations on the first phase have been completed and the focus has moved to internal fitting out and finishing, with the first apartments due to complete in November.
- Apartments in most areas have now been formed and are currently in various stages of completion from first fixing to decoration.
- Externally, roof works and elevational treatments continue to progress allowing the scaffold removal to occur after which landscaping works can be undertaken.
- Investigations and design works for Phase 2 are at a very advanced stage with the procurement of trades and materials underway.
- The detailed planning application for the remainder of the main listed building (third phase) was submitted in October.

Lawrence Baker (New Care Home Facility – Plot H):

- Continue with external façade to all elevations
- Internally screed works, mechanical and electric first fix works are progressing
- Roof trusses are scheduled to commence during November



Working hours

The current approved working hours are:

- Monday to Friday: 7am to 7pm
- Saturdays: 8am to 4pm
- Sundays and Bank Holidays: No works without prior permission.

The extended hours approved by Wandsworth Council will help ease congestion on trains and public transport, ensuring the safety of those who travel to work. To minimise impact on our neighbours, work over the additional hours will be limited to internal trades with minimised external noisy activity.

Youth Shelter design competition

STEP and SRM in partnership with the Trust, launched a schools competition for young people to design the new youth shelter for the park called 'The Hangout'. In total we received 22 submission from two schools, Ernest Bevin and St John Bosco.

The standard of entries was very impressive, with the top four designs being reviewed by STEP and the Trust after an initial shortlist by SRM colleagues. The final two were shared with Springfield Community Forum before a winner was chosen.

Congratulations to the winning entry from St John Bosco School. All entry applicants have been offered a site walk and offered an 'Introduction to Construction' presentation, with a workshop being organised for the winning entrant to bring the design to life. The Hangout will be installed in the newly developed park in the coming years.

Barratt London donate to Trust Charity

Every month Barratt London donates £1,000 to a local organisation of its choice which is improving the quality of life for those living in the vicinity of one of its developments or offices across the Capital.

As the country's largest housebuilders Barratt London is committed to leading the industry not just in the quality of its homes and its ability to build new communities, but through its work with charities and good causes to improve the neighbourhoods where its homes will be built.

The Trust's charity was successful with a bid of £1,000 which will go towards supporting mental health provision within the area.

School Recruitment and Careers Days

SRM and the Trust have been out visiting schools advertising careers and recruitment opportunities. SRM visited St John Bosco College where they held a talk on careers in construction and held some mock interviews.

Both the Trust and SRM also attended Southfields Academy Careers Fair in October to give pupils information about careers in construction and working for the NHS.



MP Visits

Sutton and Merton MPs, Elliot Colburn and Stephen Hammond, and Richmond MPs Sarah Olney and Munira Wilson visited the Trust recently to tour our services and learn more about the progress made on the developments at Springfield.

As part of the tour, the groups visited some of the new residential units, as well as the Trust's two new mental health facilities, Trinity and Shaftesbury Buildings, which are scheduled for completion towards the end of 2022.

The visit also involved a tour of the Trust's National Deaf Service on Bluebell Ward, meeting staff and finding out more about the specialist care provided.

Further visits are scheduled with local Labour MPs.
